## The 52<sup>nd</sup> Annual Speech Day

The 52<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary Speech Day of N.T. Heung Yee Kuk Yuen Long District Secondary School was successfully held at our School Hall on 15 December 2023 (Friday). Principal YUEN reported that our students have been excelling scholastically, gaining wide acclaim from the public. Our students attained excellent results in the 2023 HKDSE Examination, with a total haul of 42 Level 5\*\*. They attained 74.7% Level 4 or above, and 41.2% Level 5 or above in the total number of subjects sat. In total, 85.6% of our S.6 graduates have met the general entrance requirements for local undergraduate university programmes, and 50% of them were admitted to the degree programmes of the three main local universities. WONG King-tsung had the best performance, attaining Level 5\*\* in four subjects and Level 5\* in two subjects; NG Lok-tin and CHU Long-yiu both attained Level 5\*\* in four subjects and Level 5 in one subject.

Heung Chung has put great emphasis on students' whole-person development, aiming to cultivate students' patriotic sentiments, sense of national identity, and positive values and attitudes through an array of activities aligning with the theme 'Be Grateful, Be Proactive, Be Positive'. Principal Yuen briefly reported a series of Patriotic Education-related activities and our students' outstanding achievements in various aspects including outstanding students awards, bilingualism and triliteracy, science and mathematics, community services, sports, and art. The different prizes and awards obtained show our students' excellence and their all-round development in both academic and extra-curricular activities.

Ms. Janice TSE Siu-wa, JP, Permanent Secretary for Environment and Ecology (Environment) presented prizes to outstanding prize-winners and gave us an inspiring speech. She encouraged our students to be not only dutiful and responsible students who uphold diligence and conscientiousness, but also responsible citizens who are well-aware of issues about environmental conservation, waste reduction, energy conservation, and universal benevolence.
